



## TROOP 52 - INSTRUCTOR

### GENERAL INFORMATION

**Type:** Appointed by the Scoutmaster

**Term:** 6 months

**Reports to:** Scoutmaster and SPL

**Description:** The Instructor teaches Scouting skills.

**Comments:** The Instructor will work closely with the SPL, ASPL and Troop Guides under the guidance of the Scoutmaster. The Instructor does not have to be an expert but should be able to teach the Scoutcraft skills needed for Tenderfoot, Second Class, and First Class ranks. The troop can have more than one instructor.

### QUALIFICATIONS

**Age:** none

**Rank:** 1st Class or higher

**Experience:** Moderate to Experienced Scout

**Attendance:** 65% over 6 months

### PERFORMANCE REQUIREMENTS

**Training:** You must attend the troop Junior Leader Training even if you have attended in the past.

**Attendance:** You are expected to attend 65% of all troop meetings (the dates of instruction are mandatory), select Junior Leaders' Council meetings, outings, and service projects. Instruct at four Troop meetings in a six month period. (Two minimum self instruction, if the Instructor obtains two guest speakers.) If you can not attend your scheduled instruction date you are expected to get another Instructor to take your place. If you have an unexcused absence, for your instruction date, you can be removed from office.

**Effort:** You are expected to given this job your best effort.

### GENERAL LEADERSHIP RESPONSIBILITIES

**Uniform:** Set the example by wearing your uniform correctly. This means that you will wear all of the parts of the troop uniform, shirttail tucked in, with all required badges in their correct locations.

**Behavior:** Set the example by living the Scout Oath and Law in your everyday life. Show Scout Spirit in everything you say and do.

**Attendance:** Set the example by being an active Scout. Be on-time for meetings and activities. You must call the Senior Patrol Leader or Scoutmaster if you are not going to be at a meeting or if you suddenly have to miss an outing. You also need to make sure that someone will assume your responsibilities, as outlined above.

Teaches basic Scouting skills in troop and patrols.
